The teachers are ready to protect the students with thermometers. Volunteers are wiping down books in the Library. Our gate staff keeps us safe, too!



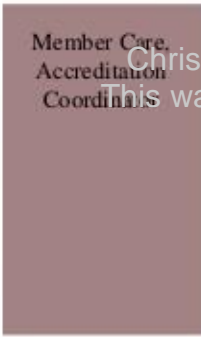

P.T.F. sponsored activities can include

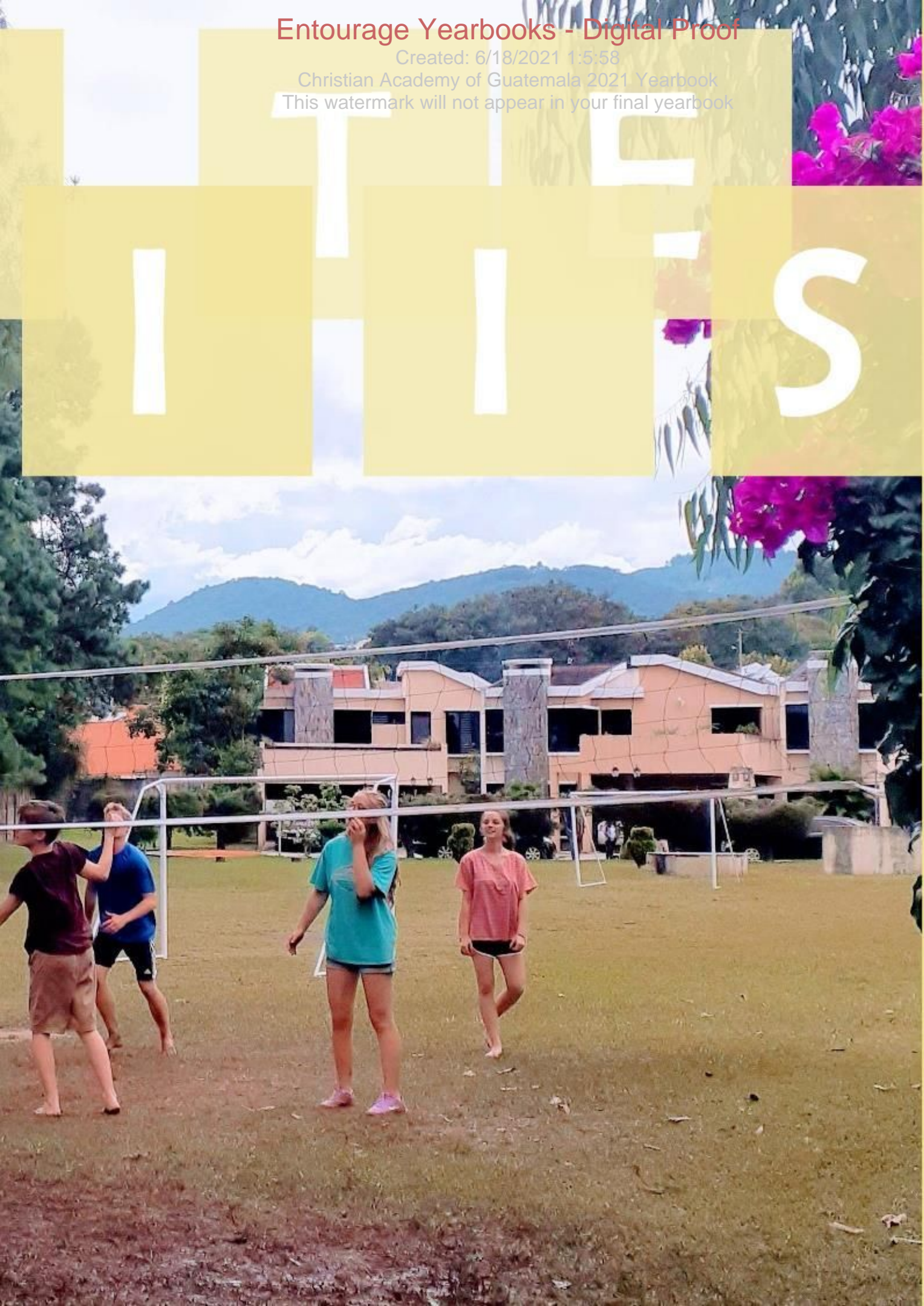

Celebrating Independently

As the 15th of September approached, Guatemalans eagerly awaited the festivities it holds. It is a time full of cheerful communion, illuminated by colorful fireworks and filled with delicious foods. They celebrate their freedom from Spanish rule and joyfully wave their beautiful flag in a show of patriotism.

Usually, Guatemalans would join their military and schools in massive parades around their respective towns and cities and hold native dances and parties. They would also carry torches, which is done in commemoration of the journey horsemen made when announcing Guatemala's independence across Central America. Torch runners would travel across their towns celebrating and waving the Guatemalan flag in front of them. However this year, due to the spread of COVID-19,

coming together to celebrate was not possible. As per the decree of President Alejandro Giammattei, all public festivities would be canceled and instead "celebrated within our hearts". He invited us to celebrate amongst ourselves but with responsible distancing.

In commemoration of Guatemala's 199th year of emancipation, the Guatemalan flag was raised in front of the Plaza de Constitución in Zone 1 of the Guatemalan capital. This event was overseen by President Alejandro Giammattei, who gave a discourse promising to work for unity, peace, and development within Guatemala. He stressed the importance of celebrating responsibly and asked Guatemalans to value liberty when thinking of the present and building for the future.



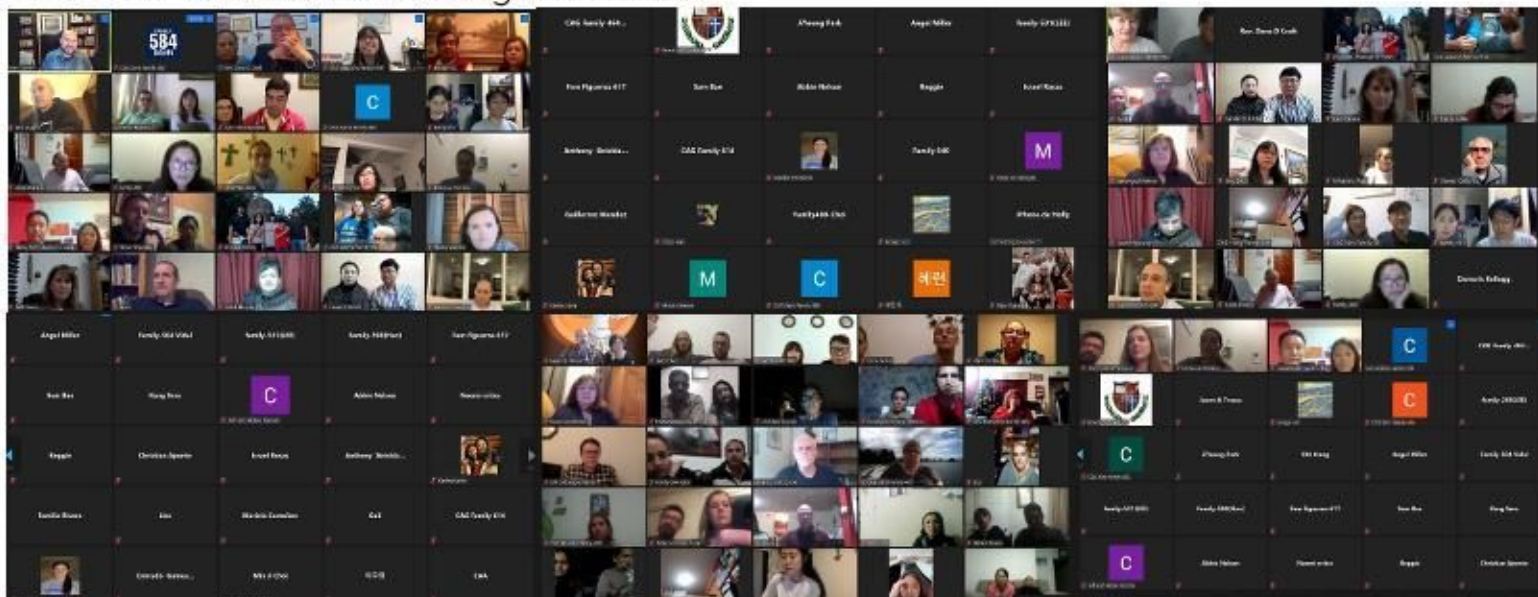

English

Expand Your Mind

English and literature are amazing things to study and understand. They help us talk and learn about other people. This is what teachers say about English.

Mrs. Patton said, "...I love to read, I love literature, I love everything that goes with literature, like the illusions and symbolism. Literature is something where the authors are always asking the basic questions that everyone asks about life: 'Why are we here?', 'What is my purpose?', 'What am I going to do when I'm here?' and you can find all those answers in the literature....I see literature as a great way to expand your mind and to learn how to think and to learn how to apply our Christian worldview to all those time-old questions...[English is] Fantastically fun and filled with awesome adventures."

Ms. Park said, "I can share to students that reading is a privilege, not a chore or something that we have to do. It really is a privilege because we get to learn so many things... Reading can be so entertaining and freeing where we can go into our own world. I also love grammar. Grammar is one of my favorite parts of English... The best thing about English is reading a book altogether... I love that everyone has such different backgrounds that cause different perspectives of books... I hope my students will learn that English is something we will never perfect... English class is a time to learn to express yourself through language, through poetry, through literature, but it's also a time to learn about other people's thoughts through the English language."



Social Studies

Love Cultures, Love People

Social Studies and History teach us about the past and how we can change the future. This is what teachers say about Social Studies.

Mr. Miller said, "I enjoy learning about History and as I am teaching I am also learning more about it too... The same mistakes have happened over history so that hopefully "we" can learn from them and not make them again...[History is] learning about cultures of those near to us and far from us to better understand the differences in all of us. Learning from the past to make better choices in the present and future."

Mrs. Morales said, "I like to learn about other cultures. I like to learn about other countries... First, they[the students] can be happy and content being in Guatemala and maybe by knowing about Guatemala, they can enjoy being here and by also knowing about the culture here, they can love people. And teaching about World Cultures as I think that my goal is to open their minds so that they can love the cultures, they can love people. In heaven we are going to be from different countries, different cultures and God loves every person. Doesn't matter where you are from, He loves us."

Mrs. Miller said, "I just want students to think for themselves. I want them to not just swallow information because somebody convinced them they were smart and should be followed. I want kids to look at a situation and be able to judge that situation based on a foundation that will help them come to good conclusions."



Math

One Right Answer

Math is used in everyday life and needs to be taught. It is essential, that everyone learns math at some point in their lives. This is what our teachers have to say about the math.

Ms. Weldon said, "I really enjoy math. I think math is one of the subjects that makes sense because it doesn't matter what language you come from or your background. Math is pretty much the same wherever you're at... Math is all around us, even numbers are within the Bible."

Mr. Clyne said, "There is one right answer (in math), but there are many many different ways to come up with that one right answer... They can apply the equations in different situations to different problems and most importantly how they can apply the different equations to their everyday life so they can do what they need to do in life... Math is a way to order everything that we see and to write laws and equations that govern that nature."

"To me, it (math) is a beautiful way to observe things about God's creation because math only works because of the way God created everything to work together, so all these formulas work because God knew that ahead of time and it's figuring out something that He did... Math helps us perform our everyday tasks and teaches our brain to think logically... it [Math U See] is carried out in a small group setting in order to adjust to individual student pace and give ample time for questions and feedback," said Ms. Murphy.

Mrs. Cojon said, "Math is a system of logically solving problems and it is the language in which God has written the universe," said Mrs. Cojon

Mrs. Zhu wrote, "Math is about numbers, shapes, quantity, arrangement, etc. It is about an order. It is about analysis and reasoning. It is about learning, practicing, applying, and then innovating. Math is the key to open the door to the world of applied science. Math is a reflection of the truth revealed by God: if we can find a solution to a math problem following the right procedures, we can be with God following His Words."

Science

The Creativity of God

Science is a wonderful subject, allowing us to see how the world works and how God designed it. This is what our teachers have to say about science.

Mr. Clyne said, "We can discover a whole bunch of really cool things about God's creation and about how the Earth is the way that it is and why it is. We can find different laws that govern nature and just see the beauty and the complexity and the wisdom that God designed the earth with... I hope that my students can learn to apply the concepts that they learn in their everyday life and I hope that they can just see the beauty of God's creation through the different things that we study in physics... Science is the way that we can identify and, again, see God's creation and put some order and principles to God's creation."

Mrs. Pixcar said, "I think science reveals the creativity of God and creation as well as His love for us. It shows so much detail and creativity of design, but also the complexity that exists all around us. I believe that reveals the heart of God for man and shows how much He loves us and enjoys beauty and complexity... Science is a journey of searching and discovering and investigating our questions and ultimately it is a path that leads us back to God."

Mrs. Cojon said, "I also like it because it is an application of many of the things you learn in math you can apply them into science... I think, as a Christian teacher, the best thing is learning how to investigate God's world and way, there are so many ways that we can see the glory of God in science and I like bringing those things together... Science is a body of knowledge about the world that, in the methods that we use to find that knowledge. Science is always growing and changing through investigation."

Mr. Larimer said, "The best thing about science is seeing God's character in His creation as you study science... I think a big thing about science is to be able to know how to use the scientific method. How to do experiments correctly and I hope my students learn to see God's goodness and power and design in creation as they study science... Science is an orderly process used to discover the truths about God's creation. Science is a very useful tool for solving real-world challenges."

Mrs. Miller said, "AP CSP teaches students the structure of the online world that is around us all. It teaches the students how the internet functions and then, in turn, teaches how to provide security in the online environment and how to protect against those who would seek to use computers poorly. Much of the class is teaching the students the beginning logic of coding and how to write a program that will benefit somebody... There aren't right answers to lots of questions in APCSP so it is fun to watch students use their brains to create even better solutions than I could come up with."

Bible

A Time For God

Bible is an amazing subject that is taught at our school. It teaches us about God's word and how to live rightly. This is what teachers say about Bible.

Mr. Clyne said, "I find it amazing and encouraging to share God's love and His story throughout all eternity, hopefully making the story come alive for them... To fall in love with the word of God. His word is rich with stories, advice, and wisdom. If the students can learn to love the Bible and live their lives according to the Bible they will go a long way."

Mrs. Metzger said, "I teach the Bible because I am passionate about helping others to have the tools to study the Bible for themselves... My hope is that my students will catch my passion for studying Scripture and my passion to walk according to what Scripture says."

Ms. Vallarsaid, "I love being able to share Christ with the kids and help them learn more about Christ and what led up to his coming, death, and resurrection... The best about being is helping students enjoy learning and help them achieve the goals that Christ had put in their paths."

Mr. Malczewski said, "The Bible is a process that is made real by the Holy Spirit and something that we have to live out and share with other

people... What I want to do is help prepare students to do that [have a normal conversation with people who have opposing views]... The best thing about the Bible is that it's simple enough for little children to accept and they can become Christians... but then it's big enough for people like me where I want to study things and read things and really delve into them. It's big enough where I can read it over and over and over and still get something from it."

Ms. Park said, "I want to be able to help the students to apply what they have learned in Bible into their own lives so that it is not just knowledge... I want it to be something that really touches their heart and plants a seed in their heart so that they can grow rooted in the word and be able to apply those things in their own walks with God... I just want my kids to know that God is the same always but there are so many different sides to God that our journey is to walk with Him every day and get to know Him more every single day... Bible class is an opportunity to set aside time during school for God to speak to us through His word, His wisdom, and knowledge... Bible class is to learn that walking with God is also corporate, like with people, not on our own."

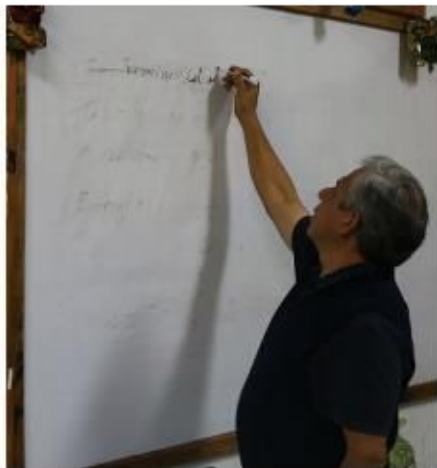

Profe Recinos said, "This one specifically is not taught well in schools... My passion for teaching this subject has helped me make it enjoyable and interesting so that my students can be excited about learning it... The best thing about Spanish is its history and the linguistic influences other languages have had on it... The reason we read so many novels in my class is to help students learn how to read in Spanish. It helps them learn how to pronounce words properly and get a hang on the grammar, writing, and syntax. Reading especially also helps the conjugations of verbs and the idioms. This allows students to appropriate the language of the place, which would be Guatemala here at C.A.G.... Spanish is in my blood and DNA. I love it's diversity and flexibility."

Mrs. Albisurez said, "Spanish provides various cognitive and social advantages, since it is one of the most used languages in the professional and business worlds... I teach intermediary level Spanish. I make the effort to put emphasis on the curriculum and biblical integrations. We focus on teaching ideals and values such as 'love your neighbor', not lying, and appreciate honesty. In my class, students learn about the cultures of the different Spanish-speaking countries, tenses, and vocabulary... Spanish is viewed as the most romantic of languages, which encourages its teaching since many are interested in doing so all around the world."

Mrs. Rivera said, "I like teaching Spanish as it is important to teach students how to properly speak our language. It is important to know how to write it properly so that one may appreciate the richness that Spanish contains. I also like teaching Spanish because of the activities where students can develop their creativity in writing... Students can be creative so as to unleash their maximum

creativity... One of the best things about Spanish is the great expressional variety it contains for many situations... I want students to learn the adequate use of words... So that students are unafraid to speak. Spanish is an extremely rich language. It is a beautiful language. It has so many forms that help us express ourselves."

Mrs. Morales said, "I like to teach Spanish because I think it's important for them to know more than one language... Also that the student will communicate very well because it's going to be helpful for your life, for you ministry, for everything you do is going to be helpful knowing another language... I enjoy teaching Spanish for beginners because I like to see their improvement... I teach AP Spanish, it's for advanced students, but that is also a challenge and the best thing of that is seeing in my students what they can do... They learn how to do a speech and write very well... My goal is that they can communicate... they can read, they can listen, they can understand, they can talk."

You never see Mrs. Morales without a smile! Mrs. Morales is currently teaching AP Spanish to prepare students for college level Spanish education.

A Creative and Practical Skill

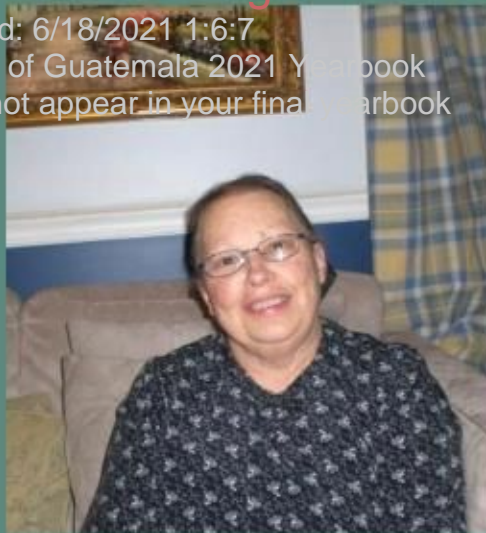

C.A.G. Honor Society (CHS)

The C.A.G. Honor Society (CHS) is chartered by the National Honor Society (NHS), which is a large organization. The NHS has four pillars which are scholarship, excellence(character), service, and leadership. They provide scholarships for colleges in the U.S.A. that address these four pillars.

Mr. Malczewski is the advisor of CHS. He has been the adviser for around seven years and in 1986 he was also a member of the NHS. He said that he is a person who likes to read and think and who is recognized for academics which is one reason why he is the adviser. CHS is for students to be recognized for academics like he is.

To become a member of CHS there is a process that you must go about. To join CHS you must be a sophomore, junior, or senior. 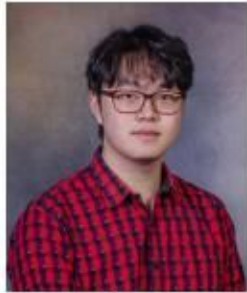

Journalism is influential. It can shine a light on issues such as bullying or inequality, and it can promote honesty. Quill and Scroll is an International Honorary Society for High School Journalists that was created in 1926. Its goal is to "encourage, support, and recognize individual student initiative and achievement in scholastic journalism, regardless of the medium."

Mr. Jeff Browne the Executive Director of Quill and Scroll says, "It means you're part of a 94-year-old legacy of excellence, both journalistic and academic. It means that your school has a chance to create a chapter that stands for ethical journalism and truth. It means that your chapter has a chance to create events that promote media literacy and community within your school, city, and country. It means that journalism is more than just a school activity — it's a valuable asset of any free society and a critical part of a strong education."

Quill and Scroll has eight guiding principles which are truth, learning, leadership, loyalty, initiative, integrity, judgment, and friendship. Students must meet requirements needed to be recommended. Each student must be of sophomore, junior or senior classification. They must have the equivalent of a B grade average, or be in the upper third of their class in general scholastic standing, either for the year of their election or for the cumulative total of all high school work. They must have done superior work in some phase of journalism or school media work. They may be staffers of a magazine, newspaper, yearbook, news organization, online site or radio/television station at the school, or one conducted by an external organization. They must be recommended by the supervisor or by the committee governing the media. They must be approved by the Quill and Scroll Executive Director..

Quill and Scroll offers students different opportunities from scholarships, contests, and critiques. The lifetime membership is an open door to a network of like minded peers and professionals. It provides real-world experiences and an opportunity for students to showcase their work in the journalism with potential rewards. Quill and Scroll gives an identity, or belonging, with a student's specific talents in journalism.

Discipleship provides a unique opportunity for classes to grow with each other in fellowship, as they continue to learn, and discover more about God and His love.



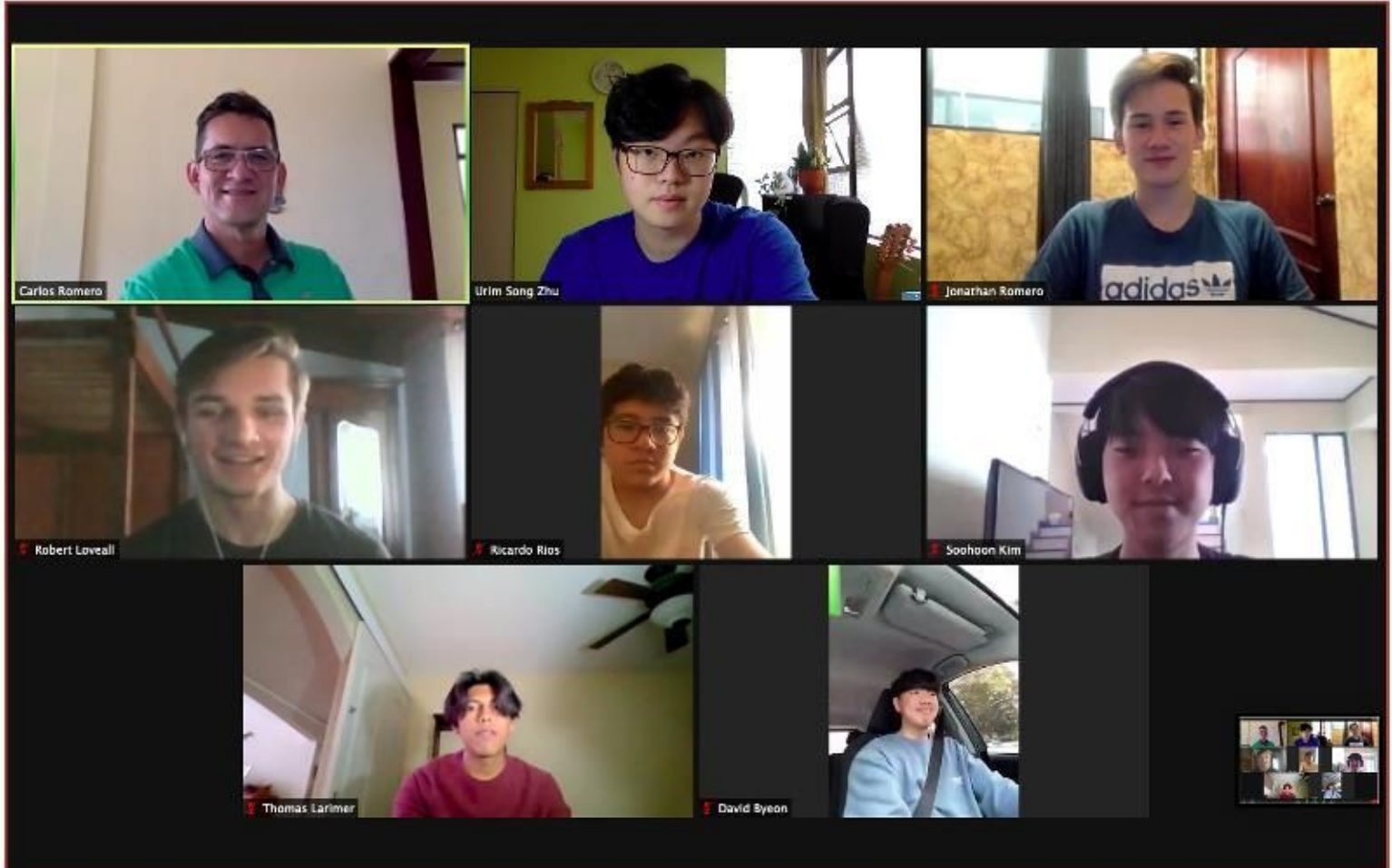
