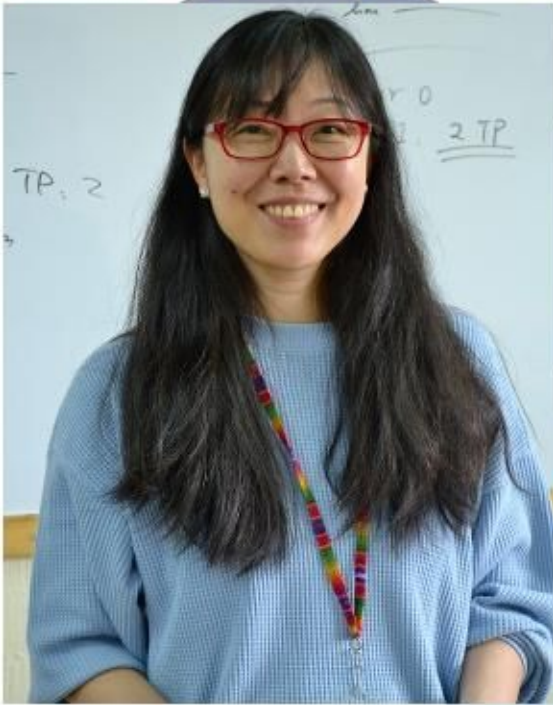
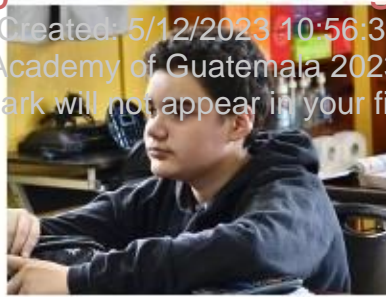


Life's Greatest Teacher History

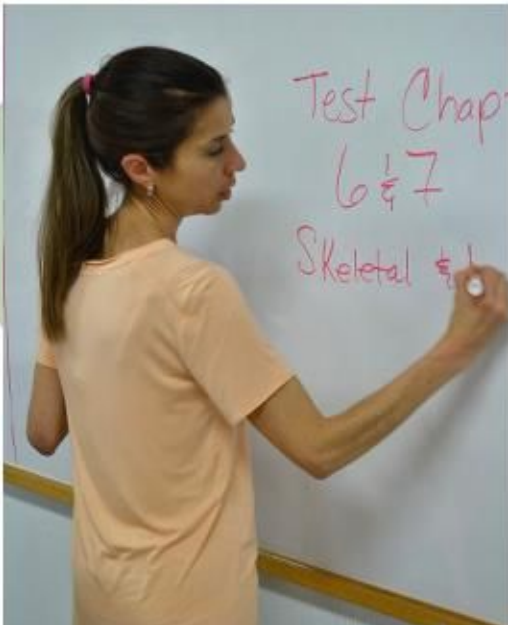

Teachers: Rebecca Morales, Josefa Molina, Maria Moscoto

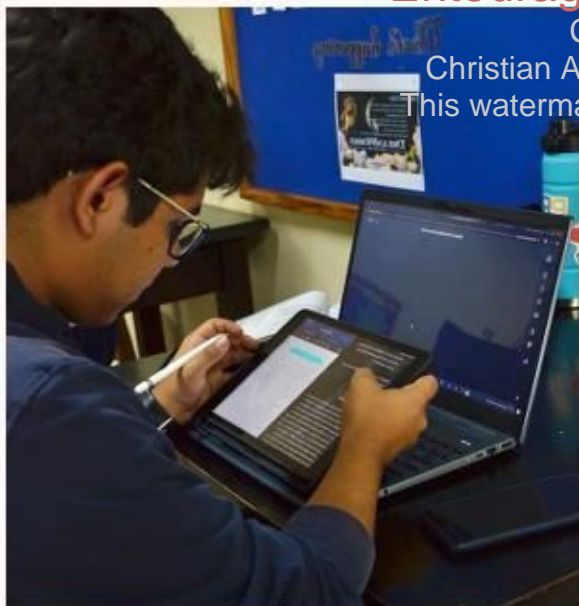

Student Media

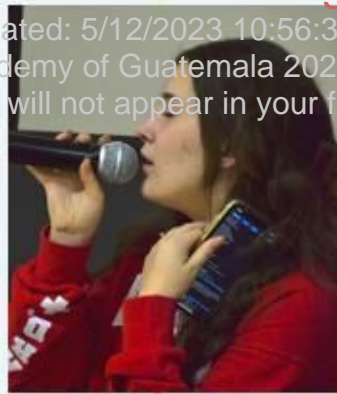

High school is a bumpy road where people discover their talents and weaknesses, so make the most out of all situations rather than just survive it. Whenever you feel down and are struggling, look around the school, and you will find many people who care about you and will help you succeed, or you could chat with me about everything: complaints and HW SOS :) Also, enjoy high school, and don't take it for granted, do everything you want to do now when you are in a safe environment rather than in the "real" world. I am writing this, 5 months from graduation and time really does fly so fast, so make friends, be connected with friends and God, take challenges, and be open. Soan & Taesung: We first met in 2019 during the pandemic, and since then I am really grateful that I got to meet you guys. For SoAn, thank you for being such a goofy, positive friend that always makes me laugh and makes the best out of all situations even when situations are dumb and bad like failing our English quizzes and forgetting to study. Thank you for being my partner in crime. As for TaeSung, I want to say that you are an amazing person who is talented in many aspects like drawing and helping others. I really wished that you stayed in Guatemala for your senior year, but I am sure that God had a plan for you in South Korea, and look now you are doing

karate, playing drums, and other things that you couldn't do here. I thank you for all the good and funny memories. We all better hang out in Korea!! Joshua & David & Matthew & Jorge: Each of you guys was special to me in different ways.
